- Guideline 8 published: A Guide to the Treatment and Control of Equine Gastrointestinal Parasite Infections. It has been translated by six national associations.
- New modular guide series 5 published: Control of Vector-Borne Diseases in Dogs and Cats. It has also been translated into Dutch, Hungarian and Polish.
- 5 new fact sheets have been published:
